Unexplained cardiac death is one of the biggest killers of Australians under fifty.

In almost every case, death strikes those who are fit and healthy, with no apparent symptoms.

Cardiologists and researchers believe that unexplained cardiac death is claiming the lives of more than 1000 young Australians every year.

The Ross Dennerstein Foundation has been established by his family and friends to assist cardiologists, researchers and educators help explain the unexplained.

Who was Ross Dennerstein

Ross Dennerstein was born to fly. He was the youngest pilot ever recruited by Australian Airlines. Ross was a First Officer at 21, and went on to become a Captain at 28. He was an enthusiastic sportsman and an outstanding pilot who made a significant contribution to the Australian airline industry, accumulating 14,000 flight hours.

In these circumstances he was supremely fit. His health profile was exactly the opposite of someone at cardiac risk. He had none of the risk factors or physical symptoms generally associated with cardiac death. This was confirmed by comprehensive regular health checks that his job required him to complete. His cardiac death at age 47 was unexpected, and remains unexplained.

The Ross Dennerstein Foundation

The Ross Dennerstein Foundation is partnering with the Baker Institute, one of the world's leading heart research organisations, to lead a national collaborative effort with cardiologists and researchers to investigate unexplained cardiac death. The program will be a world-first research initiative in terms of scope, scale and thoroughness. It will build a critical mass of evidence on which to build a very robust and on-going research program.
